Revelation 14:6 – "Then I saw another angel flying directly overhead, with an eternal gospel to proclaim to those who dwell on earth, to every nation and tribe and language and people." During the Reformation, this text was used to refer to Luther's ministry and the Lutheran message. We have an eternal Gospel to proclaim. Christ has freed us from our sins without any works on our part. We are saved by grace alone! And, ironically enough, Luther said this should make him the "apostle of works." Once we are freed by grace, we are truly free to serve God in works that flow from thankfulness and praise.

- * Transition Team Updates: Contract signed for 12 months with Pr. Brad Miller for the Intentional Interim Senior Pastor position starting October 1st. Contract can be extended by six month increments as needed. Housing provided by Gordie and Nettie Billmark October to May. Oral Report by Church Doctor Ministries on Wednesday September 17th. Staff Debrief and Leadership Dinner on September 18th
- * Property: still waiting for painting to be completed on siding by Rollex. Dishwasher to be repaired by Central Lakes Restaurant supply. Awaiting parts. Sidewalks replacement (by anonymous donation) will be sometime next year after the City of Garfield repaves the street in front of the church. Paul Schwartz donated the sealcoating in parking lot. Our neighbor Bob Peterson donated his labor to repaint the sidewalk.
- * Stewardship: New campaign will begin sometime in October. Online and QR Code giving options are still being explored
- * Pie & Ice Cream Social: approximately \$1800 was raised to purchase military Bible sticks from Faith Comes by Hearing

Letter of Farewell

September 2025

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

With a heart filled with mixed emotions, I write this farewell message to express my deep gratitude and affection for all of you. It is with a sense of both sadness and excitement that I bid farewell to the beloved congregation of St. Luke's, which has been a central part of my life for the last 35+ years.

As I reflect upon my time at St. Luke's, I cannot help but be overwhelmed by the countless blessings that God has showered upon me and my family. Each day, I have witnessed the power of faith and the transformative love of our Lord working through the lives of so many of you. Your unwavering commitment to your faith has been an inspiration to me, and I am truly grateful for the opportunity to have been your pastor.

Throughout my time at St. Luke's, your prayers have been a source of immense strength and support. The knowledge that I was lifted up in prayer by this community has sustained me through both the joys and challenges of my ministry. Your prayers have been a reminder that we are all interconnected, united in our faith, through Jesus Christ.

I am particularly grateful for the trust you placed in me during the most intimate moments of your lives. It has been an honor and a privilege to baptize your children (211 baptisms), to bless your marriages (37 weddings), and to accompany you in times of grief and loss (123 funerals/memorial services). These sacred moments have deepened my own faith in the profound love that God has for each of us.

If in *any way* I have sinned against you, I do earnestly ask for your forgiveness. If I have helped you in any way, please give thanks to the Lord our God. Please have no concern about personal things you have shared with me in confidence. Confidentiality continues until my last breathe. Needless to say, any time we make changes, life can be difficult. I humbly ask that you continue to pray for me and my family, even as our paths separate.

I have no doubt that St. Luke's will continue to grow in faith, love, and service, as you are guided by the Holy Spirit. God has a plan for you and will provide a new shepherd to be your pastor. (At 12:01am on October 1, 2025, I will cease to be your pastor.) I will not be available to officiate at any occasion. I will not be available for visitations or advice. Pr. Brad Miller will be serving you as the Intentional Interim Pastor until you can issue a call to a new shepherd.

As I move on in the ministry God has prepared for me, I take with me the memories and experiences I have shared with all of you. You have left an indelible mark on my heart, and I will forever cherish the relationships we have formed.

No matter the distance that separates us, God continues to unite us, for all eternity, through our faith in Christ Jesus. I pray that you continue to grow in faith, as you hold fast to the word of God. I pray that you will be a light shining in the darkness, and that you will open your doors and your hearts to all those who are in need.

The Interim Ministry Process—A Nautical Analogy

Keep the Boat Afloat

Continue the basic ministry operations of Word & Sacrament, education, and pastoral care with as little interruption as practical. Deal with typical church crises and challenges as they arrive.

Churches, like ships, contain a complex set of systems—all of which can consume resources and attention. Staying afloat is priority #1!

Take Bearings

Assess the basic health of the congregation, especially in context of its history and future. Examine the findings and reflect on the most relevant insights.

Whether by sextant or GPS, ship handlers need to know where they are at all times and what condition all systems are in.

Underway Overhaul & Replenishment

While the congregation grieves the recent past, fix the things that need immediate attention—so that when the next settled pastor arrives his or her starting months are not dominated by overdue essential tasks.

Ships sometimes have the luxury of a Dry Dock. When in Dry Dock, the crew depart and all functions stop during extended maintenance.
Churches never have that luxury! Churches are always "underway" and need to continue to function while fixing various systems.

Set General Heading

Help congregational leaders chart a general course forward. This is essential for the Call or Search Committee to be able to seek and communicate with the best possible candidates. Implementation and fine-tuning of a future path will commence once the new settled pastor is on board.

Ships must be equipped with proper supplies and charts and staffed for the voyage ahead. Churches, too, need to ready themselves for the expected challenges and opportunities in the next 3 to 7 years.

Prepare for Change of Command

A good Interim process is all about transition. These months are the pivot point between history and future. Though the Interim Pastor needs to be amenable and possess good people skills, they also need to always be thinking about how interactions prepare the way for the next settled pastor.

Command sounds a bit too corporate or military for many churches. But, regardless of how team-centric or empowerment-based your next pastor may be, their unique style and personality will mark a new era.
